The meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. by President Vincent Grady.

1st Public Comment:

None.

Nominations for officers are opened:

Motion by Patrick Droney to nominate Maureen Brennan for Secretary/Treasurer and second by Christopher Foley. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote. There are no other nominations for Secretary/Treasurer. Patrick Droney made a motion to close nominations and cast ballot for Maureen Brennan for Secretary/Treasurer with a second by Paul Meunier. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Christopher Foley to nominate Patrick Droney for Vice President and second by Maureen Brennan. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote. There are no other nominations for Vice President. Mauren Brennan made a motion to close nominations and cast a ballot for Vice President for Patrick Droney with a second by Paul Benis. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Christopher Foley to nominate Vincent Grady for President and second by Paul Benis. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote. There are no other nominations for President. Christopher Foley made a motion to close nominations and cast a ballot for Vincent Grady for President with second by Patrick Droney. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

The minutes from the April 8 (amended to note special meeting) and May 1 Special Meetings and April 10, 2025 Regular Commission Meeting were reviewed. Motion by Christopher Foley and second by Paul Benis to accept the minutes as presented and the motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

The Training Officer's report was reviewed and discussed. Motion by Paul Meunier and second by Maureen Brennan to approve the report as presented. Commissioner Foley inquired about electronic payments for fees and there is not a call for this. Commissioner Foley asked what a

command board is and it was explained. There is one new volunteer applicant. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed and discussed. Motion by Vice President Droney and second by Paul Benis. Commissioner Foley inquired about clothing allowance Tier 1 & 2 and it was explained that it is for volunteer FFs that return and Tier 1 is all clothing allowance. We are not paying mileage for fulltime FFs to come back. Christopher Foley suggested a CD for earning interest and we will move forward with this. The motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

The Fire Marshal's Report was reviewed and discussed. Motion by Vice President Droney and second by Paul Benis to approve the report as presented. Discussed AT&T adding a cell tower and possible use of the former 99. Stardust fire was from incorrect disposal of cooking grease. Chief advised the department did a good job on this and that is a far ride. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

The Chief's Report was reviewed and discussed. Chief advised that we had 12 less calls compared to previous year. No major incidents in our district but we provided mutual aid in a couple major incidents. Motion by Vice President Droney and second by Christopher Foley to approve the report as presented. President Grady asked for Building and Grounds report to include if it is an emergency or not. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

Committee Reports:

Apparatus: Cost and diagram available for Engine 14 w/proposed cost of \$1.2 million and it is a four-year lead time. Price lock is guaranteed once contract is signed. Special meeting will be voted on and public be informed of vote and educated on the purchase.

Board Member Comments:

Vice President Droney wished all a safe and happy summer and thanks the firefighters for handling some of these difficult calls that have occurred lately.

Maureen Brennan echoed Vice President Droney's comments.

Commissioner McGuire apologized for tardiness due to traffic.

Christopher Foley advised that the audit committee members need to be updated. He also suggested a threshold whereas a payments over a certain amount would need to be approved by the board.

New Business:

A motion is made by Vice President Droney to suspend the July and August regular commission meetings with a second by Paul Benis. Commissioner Foley thanks DC Higgins for sending out updates over the summer. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

Motion by Vice President Droney to hold separate apparatus meeting at the September 11 regular meeting but motion is rescinded.

A motion is made by Paul Meunier to make a one-time exception to change our regular meeting on September 11, 2025 to September 4, 2025 to allow for observance of 9/11 with a second by Paul Benis. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

A motion is made by Vice President Droney on a date TBD in September 2025 to present to the voters a replacement for Engine 14 second by Paul Meunier. Motion passes by unanimous voice vote.

2nd Public Comment:

Debbie Chapin of Old King St. states that she agrees that larger expenses should be voted on by the commissioners, stating that something happened with the Purple Heart Museum committee, and advised that meeting dates need to be sent.
